This inCERT highlights the need for urban dwellers to follow the suggestion of Nature Regina; to grow 1 sq metre of native plants per person for pollinators and birds who are being stressed due to climate change.

"As small as one square meter of garden or 2 large planter pots on a balcony is enough to start making a difference for our pollinating friends. If everyone in Saskatoon planted 1 sq. m. we would have 85 acres of native plants; in Regina 62 acres. What should you grow? If you are just starting out here are 12 plants to attract and benefit butterflies:
