

Peace and joy to you, friend, from Mennonite Church Saskatchewan.

A few weeks ago many of my contacts received a scam email purporting to be from me asking a few thousand dollars worth of gift cards. When I found out, I posted a message to social media assuring folks that the email wasn't from me and that if ever I were to ask for money, I would do so directly.

This is a message *asking you directly* to consider giving to support the ministries we share as Mennonite Church Saskatchewan.

Since I stepped into the role of Interim Executive Minister in January 2022, my delight has been in discovering more deeply the good work we share in together. Sometimes this means rolling up our sleeves on an MDS project, cleaning up dishes after a fundraiser supper, or sewing the binding on a quilt. Other times, it means sharing our money.

The gifts we share support, for instance, the work of International Witness partners and local Christian ministries in Thailand, the Philippines, China, Korea, Ethiopia, Colombia, and elsewhere. I'm overcome with gratitude and awe each time I hear from these partners about their work through Witness Support Network Zoom calls. (If your congregation isn't part of a Witness Support Network, talk with me about how you can get an invite to hear these amazing stories too!).

Together we also support Walking the Path. This group leads us toward reconciliation and more just relationships with the Indigenous Peoples of this place. (Check out the newly-premiered documentary they worked on, *Custodians: A Story of Ancient Echoes.*)

We support the newly-formed Climate Emergency Response Team, helping us mobilize care and concern, advocacy and action for the lives of those most-influenced by climate change. We support organizations working for restorative justice (like Parkland Restorative Justice, The Micah Mission, and CoSA South Saskatchewan), as well as groups resourcing people trying out new ways to be church and follow Jesus together (like the New Leaf Network).

Together we resource kids headed to camp, young adults on their way to college, new pastors transitioning into ministry and seasoned pastors facing post-pandemic realities. We offer support through our prayers and also through our pocketbooks (via one time or scheduled monthly giving).

Thank you. We can only do this work together. As we share our lives and our resources with one another, we become truly the body of the One who gave himself away for the life of the world.

Support Young Leaders in 2022

This summer 2022 two van-loads of MC Sask Youth are going to **Amplify! at Camp Valaqua in Alberta**. There are various ways to support this youth gathering; see the Amplify! Brochure for more information. *Give to MC Sask, designated "Amplify."*

MC Sask is sending two young adults to the **Young Leaders Experience** at the MC Canada Gathering in Edmonton. In specially-designed cohort experience, young people age 17-21 will have their faith and leadership skills strengthened. *Give to MC Sask, designated "YLE."*

MC Sask is sending one participant to the Mennonite World Conference **Global Youth Summit** in Salatiga, Indonesia, July 1-4. This is an incredible opportunity for a young person from MC Sask to to share in the global reality of the church and to bring home stories to shape our congregations. *Give to MC Sask, designated "GYS" to support this trip.*

Shared Ministries as MC Sask

Pastoral Leadership Commission: PLC supports pastors and congregational leaders in ministry. Donations fund learning events, retreats, and a pastoral counselling support fund. Give to MC Sask, designated "PLC."

Walking the Path: Part of Ministries, WtP works with settler and Indigenous partners to "foster and improve good relations" between MC Sask congregations and Indigenous people. Give to MC Sask, designated "Walking the Path."

Climate Emergency Response Team: The newly-formed CERT works to encourage MC Sask congregations in praying in response to climate change, in advocating for public policy changes, and in caring for those most harmed by climate change. Give to MC Sask, designated "CERT."

Shared Ministries as MC Canada

MC Sask passes along 25% of our congregational and individual giving to MC Canada for our shared nationwide ministries. Know that 25% of any undesignated funds you donate will be sent to support our MC Canada programs. However, you can also designate donations to:

International Witness: Congregations in MC Sask have joined Witness Support Networks with partnerships in S. Korea, Thailand, China, and Ethiopia. You can also support ministries in Vietnam, Congo, and Burkina Faso.

Indigenous-Settler Relations: Resourcing and coordinating regional ISR groups as we discern our shared work of solidarity with Indigenous neighbours across Turtle Island.

Climate Action: The newly-established Climate Action Coordinator will resource and nurture collaboration between regional climate working groups.

Camp Study

Over the next 9 months, MC Sask Council and Tim Nickel of Fifth Business Consulting will be purposefully listening and reflecting on the role of MC Sask's camping programs within the life and ministry of our family of congregations. Together we put our commitment to camping ministry in our support (volunteer hours, oversight, finances, etc.) of MC Sask's three camps: Camp Elim, Youth Farm Bible Camp, and Shekinah Retreat Centre. Each of these camps hold stories and sacred places for folks in our congregations.

The Camp Study will be first and foremost a listening process, consulting with the three camps and their boards, with supporters and alumni, and with congregations. We will host regional facilitated listening events so that we can your stories about the place of camps in your life. We will also be doing due diligence in examining the finances, market, and governance realities for camping programs in Saskatchewan as we listen for the voice of God's Spirit in how we support camping ministry for the next generation.
